Visiting alumni are always thrilled to see the familiar faces of Ginny P. and Jim & Virginia S. to recount a few stories from the early days of camp!

So many things have changed since that first day sixty years ago but thankfully the core experience of fun, friendship and personal growth remain clearly in focus. Each and every day I see great things all around camp. They can be small, such as a gesture of friendship shared between two campers, a group of kids excitedly reliving the latest inter-camp competition or the excitement that can be generated from a simple old fashioned game of tug of war on the 4th of July! Camp is so very different from the busy day to day lives we all live the rest of the year. It's great to see the kids slow it down, and relax into the long camp day; after all, camp is the real meaning of 24/7!
